Islam has attached extraordinary value and importance to youth and the young age. The Rasool (ﷺ) had a high <u>esteem</u> for youth. He (ﷺ) valued them and reposed a strong confidence in them. In preparation for the battle of Uhud, for instance, the Rasool (ﷺ), in <u>reverence</u> to the passions and emotions of the youth, went even against his own opinion and decided to face the enemy outside the city in an open field. Similarly, he (ﷺ) preferred a teenager Osama bin Zaid (ﷺ) even over the most respected elders like Abu Baker

(﴿) and Umar Ibn Al-Khattab (﴿) to lead the military <u>expedition</u> to avenge upon the losses of the Muslim army in the battle of Mu'tah in Syria. This much love and confidence shown towards the youth necessitates that they must take the Rasool (ﷺ) as their role model and mould their lives in accordance with his teachings and practices.

The Rasool (ﷺ) spent his youth in a <u>dignified</u> and <u>sublime</u> way. Even before his accession to the position of prophethood, he (ﷺ) never indulged himself in vices that were prevalent in those days. During his youth, his nobility of soul, purity of heart, his strict <u>adherence</u> to truth and honesty and his stern sense of duty earned him the titles of "Al-Amin"—the trustworthy—and, "Al—Sadiq"—the true. Thus, he (ﷺ) set an example for the youth of the coming generations to follow the path of <u>rectitude</u> in all circumstances and always to lead a pious and pure life.

Gender inequality defines the practice of granting or denying rights or privileges to the people based on their gender. Despite the fact that women make more than 50% of the world population, gender based <u>discrimination</u> against women still remains an <u>undeniable</u> fact in Pakistan and across the globe, potentially <u>hampering</u> its socioeconomic advancement and progress. The major half of the population is <u>badly</u> neglected in almost all the fields of life, especially education, health, economic opportunities and political participation.

The issue of gender inequality is, sometimes, wrongly <u>ascribed</u> to religion. As the matter of fact, its primary causes are the various cultural norms and the patriarchal mind set.

Males are considered physically powerful and females as psychologically sensitive or weak. From birth, male and female offsprings are raised differently. Since their babyhood, boys are let to play with toys like trucks or other sports related things. Girls, on the other hand, are introduced more commonly to dolls, dresses and playhouses, where they take care of dolls as if they were children. Women are supposed to be <u>submissive</u> to men and are viewed as a property. They are not allowed to take independent decisions even about some of their very <u>fundamental</u> and <u>sheerly</u> personal matters like education, <u>marriage</u> and job etc. These trends set by the society put men and women on certain paths, and throughout life, are seen as two very different species who have very different personalities and should always stay on separate paths.
